### **Multi-Agency Risk Assessment and Management**

FVREE is proving MARAM Collaborative Practice training sessions to Tier 2, 3 & 4 professionals who respond to family violence in Melbourne's Eastern Metropolitan Region. Training is delivered online using Zoom and runs for 6 hours (including breaks). Participants are required to attend the whole day.

# MARAM COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE

## FAQ'S

### WHAT IS MARAM COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE TRAINING?

MARAM Collaborative Practice Training is for professionals who respond to family violence to learn the collaborative practice and the foundational aspects of MARAM that enable collaboration.

Training enables participants to contribute to risk assessment and collaborate for ongoing risk assessment and management, through respectful and sensitive engagement with victim survivors, information sharing, referral and secondary consultation.

### WHO SHOULD ATTEND??

Training is available to all professionals who respond to family violence in Melbourne's Eastern Metropolitan Region. While relevant to all professionals from prescribed and non-prescribed organisations, training is best suited to professionals from Tiers 2, 3 and 4 of the Victorian Government Responding to Family Violence Capability Framework (2017). This includes workers in core support or intervention agencies, mainstream and non-family violence specific support agencies and universal services and organisations.

This is NOT risk assessment training. You will need to attend other MARAM training relevant to your role. MARAM training will be delivered by government departments and Safe and Equal.

### I HAVE ATTENDED OTHER MARAM TRAINING. IS THIS TRAINING STILL RELEVANT TO ME?

Yes. The MARAM Collaborative Practice training sits alongside the other MARAM modules. It does not replicate the content of the other sessions, but enhances a professional's understanding of collaborative practice under the MARAM.

### HOW SHOULD I PREPARE FOR TRAINING?

- Read the MARAM Collaborative Practice Participant Guide
- Read the MARAM Online Training Safety Sheet
- Watch Helping end family violence - the Information Sharing Schemes and MARAM
- Complete a pre-training evaluation survey
